

				<ul> <li>Additional measures introduced at music centres to support of social distancing (e.g. signage, one-way systems)</li> <li>Group sizes adjusted according to available space to ensure staff can observe social distancing.</li> <li>Staff should ensure workspaces are well ventilated by opening windows on arrival etc.</li> <li>We recommend staff bring their own refreshments to the workplace and take breaks outside to further reduce the risk of virus transmission.</li> </ul>






<ul> <li>Teachers should not use the same equipment with different groups unless it has been thoroughly cleaned or quarantined for 72 hours.</li> <li>Tutors should never play on a student's instrument even to diagnose a problem.</li> <li>Tutors must not ask pupils to share music/lyric sheets or music stands. If it is not possible for pupils to have their own copies of material, then they should be projected instead or discarded altogether in favour of oral teaching/learning.</li> <li>Tutors should consider how they can safely distribute instruments and other resources to learners e.g. by arranging a collection/drop-off point in their teaching room/setting.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Music stands (and chairs) should be wiped down in between use by different groups.</li> <li>Tutors should avoid raising their voices when instructing pupils and should include the use of</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>The space in which singing activities take place must allow for strict social distancing between participating students and should dictate the maximum group size.</li> <li>Singing activities should not take place in a space without ventilation.</li> <li>Tutors should discourage loud singing and extremes of diction (e.g. exaggerating plosives).</li> </ul>



Hazard: Something that has the potential to cause harm

**Likelihood:** The likelihood of the hazard causing harm

Risk rating is calculated by multiplying the likelihood by the severity: e.g.: a likely chance of an accident resulting in a major injury = 3 x 4 = 12 therefore, a medium risk – within 1 month - review existing controls and consider additional ones. Regular monitoring required.
