The children will develop their imagination when acting out journey scenarios.	-Provide opportunities for children to explore colour, sound, texture in a variety of ways and using a variety of materials -Provide opportunities for children to create representations of characters from our stories through role play and art - Building a tall/ long beanstalk using a range of media - Build a bridge for the gingerbread man to cross or a safe place to hide	- Provide opportunities for children to explore colour, sound, texture in a variety of ways and using a variety of materials - Opportunities to create their own narratives within our play using small world animal toys from the story of Chicken Liken (as part of a group) - Create enclosures using large construction equipment when making a safe place for the chicks - In our music lessons we will use claves so that the children came tap out repeated rhythms	- Retell the stories we are focusing on through small world and role play. - Create animal masks and other props to support us in our play. - Look closely at the features of different animals including patterns they might have which we will attempt to recreate. - Continue to use construction materials to build homes for different animals and think about which types of construction are best to use.	- Provide opportunities for children to explore colour, sound, texture in a variety of ways and using a variety of materials, linked to our texts. - Create narratives within our play (as part of a group), becoming the characters and different professions. - Explore and model use of indoor and outdoor construction areas by offering pictorial examples to create traps for the Gruffalo and monster.
