Article of the Month

Article 1: Definition of the Child - Everyone under the age of 18 has all the rights in the Convention.

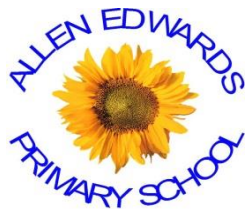
This month, we elected our School Council and House Captains. Each child that wanted to run for election was giving the opportunity to work with staff to complete their speeches and then present to their class. The children in their class then thought carefully about who they wanted to represent their voices at meetings and elected them.



Article 13: Freedom of Expression - Every child must be free to express their thoughts and opinions and to access all kinds of information, as long as it is within the law.

In class and across school, we have been celebrating diversity and raising awareness for our different identities during our Black History Month. We have developed our understanding of the importance of equality and have been recognising some of the people that have worked for change and to ensure everyone of all skin colours and cultural backgrounds have the same rights. We invited our school community in to share our work.





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Article 2: Non-Discrimination - The Convention applies to every child without discrimination, whatever their ethnicity, sex, religion, language, abilities or any other status, whatever they think or say, whatever their family background.

Article 29: Goals of Education - Education must develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to the full. It must encourage the child's respect for human rights, as well as respect for their parents, their own and other cultures, and the environment.

Article 30: Children from Minority or Indigenous Groups - Every child has the right to learn and use the language, customs and religion of their family, whether or not these are shared by the majority of the people in the country where they live.

Article 31: Leisure, Play and Culture - Every child has the right to relax, play and take part in a wide range of cultural and artistic activities.

In our aims to be recognise how we can support our local community, we have continued to support our local food banks, who are run by the Trussell Trust. We have a year round collection box at school and we
